Christian Ministries Teaching Evolution

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When I was eight years old, I remember asking my mother why the Bible says God made the world, but school says it came from the Big Bang, and my mother said, "Well, maybe God used the Big Bang." I appreciate my mother's efforts to provide an answer, but that is a common compromise Christians use when they DON'T have an answer. For many years, I believed in evolution because of this answer. I do not condemn my mother in any way for not having an answer, and today she knows the truth, but I fear that many parents are leading their children into this false doctrine when they do not know what to tell them, and regrettably, many Christian ministries support this "God used evolution" worldview.

Many of us respect, and look-up to, well-known preachers and evangelists. We grew up listening to them via our parents or grandparents, and generally assume they are the experts on the Bible and Christianity in general. We have their books and DVDs in our homes, and have benefited from some of their teachings, but we can't be respecters of persons by not questioning what these people believe when it comes to the foundations of the Bible.

We know these men claim to believe in Jesus Christ, but the foundation of Christ's message is in the book of Genesis. Genesis contains the Creation, the Fall of man, the genealogy of the bloodline of Christ, and much more. Genesis is the foundation of our Christian beliefs, so it is something I take very seriously, and all Christians should be prepared to give an answer (1Pet 3:15) a proper rebuke (Rom 16:17-18) to Christian men teaching false doctrine.

The Bible and Evolution Together?

The Bible and evolution cannot be reconciled together. Almost everything that is taught in the process of evolution is exactly opposite to the book of Genesis.

If the Bible taught millions of years for each day, as many Christian ministries support, how do plants live for millions of years without the sun? One day would not cause any problems, but they would not last one week without the light and heat of the sun. By itself, this example shows a clear logical contradiction when trying to compromise the Bible and evolution.






Geisler supports the Day-Age Theory (i.e. one day = millions of years):

Not only does he teach millions of years in his ministry, but he also believes, as Robert Schuller, that everyone in the world, Christian and pagan alike, has Salvation and will automatically get to heaven without faith in Jesus Christ.

Why Does the Age of the Earth Matter?

1) Old earth denounces the authority of God's Word. Genesis is the foundation of the Bible, and the actions that take place in Genesis not only serve as an example to mankind, but also initiate the events that lead to Christ's death and ressurection.

Can the average person read the Bible and understand it? Or do we need a cult leader to tell us what it says? For example:

The entrance of thy words giveth light; it giveth understanding unto the simple.
-Pslam 119:130

We don't need a PhD to understand God's Word. The average person should be able to read the Bible and understand what it says.

For <u>in six days</u> the LORD made heaven and earth, the sea, and all that in them is, and rested the seventh day...
-Exodus 20:11

God wrote Exodus 20:11 on rock Himself, and it's very simple to understand. If you handed the Bible to a thousand people from an isolated country, that had never heard of the Bible, creation, nor evolution, asked them to read the first chapter of Genesis, and tell you what it says: All 1,000 people would come back and say, "It says He made it in six days." So the question is not, "What does it say?" -- the question is, "Do you believe what it says?"

2) Old earth denounces the authority of Jesus Christ. He cited Genesis 25 times. (e.g. Matthew 19:4, John 5:46, etc)

Can someone believe in millions of years of evolution, and still be Saved by Jesus Christ? I would like to think so, but Jesus Christ has said otherwise:

For had ye believed Moses, ye would have believed me: for he wrote of me. But if ye believe not his writings, how shall ye believe my words?

-John 5:46-47

I am not saying one cannot believe in evolution and be Saved, but Jesus Christ wants us to use the common sense He gave us to think about how it is possible to denounce the truth of creation in six days, and still believe on Jesus Christ. I have had correspondence with a number of "old earth Christians," and each time I get into conversation with them, somewhere along the line, they denounce God's Word as written by men instead of inspired by the Lord. We cannot serve two masters (Mat 6:24), and get very nervous for people who claim to believe in evolution's old earth and still be a Christian.

- 3) Nearly every other book of the Bible refers back to the mature, fully-functional creation in Genesis. Genesis is cited 200 times in the New Testament alone. If Genesis is not literally true to God's Word as it is written, how can we trust any of the other books of the Bible to be literal in any sense?
- 4) The evolution religion relies on an old earth. If they do not have billions of years to hide their theory in, it looks really stupid. They have to protect their sacred geologic column, and that is the main reason for the protection of billions of years of evolution so they can hang on to their theory.

For <u>the wages of sin is death</u>; but the gift of God is eternal life through Jesus Christ our Lord.

Romans 6:23

For since <u>by man came death</u>, by man came also the resurrection of the dead. For as <u>in</u>

<u>Adam all die</u>, even so in Christ shall all be made alive.

When God looked at everything and said it was very good (Gen 1:31), that would mean that God is looking at billions of years of dead creatures and saying it was very good. This means the "god" that would use evolution created death, but the Bible says death came by man's sin. If God created death, and death is a natural part of life, then what was the need for Christ to die on the cross?

There are many evolutionists that know full-well that their theory eliminates the need for Jesus Christ and many moral elements of the Bible. I also used to believe evolution was true and thought along those same lines. Even famous evolutionary anthropologist, Sir Arthur Keith, knew that evolution was incompatible with Christ:

"The conclusion I have come to is this: the law of Christ is incompatible with the law of evolution... Nay, the two laws are at war with each other; the law of Christ can never prevail until the law of evolution is destroyed."

Why Christian Ministries Support Evolution

As quoted above, Billy Graham said: "Whichever way God did it makes no difference as to what man is and man's relationship to God."

Yes it does, Billy. It makes all the difference in the world how and why God did it. This is an extremely important issue. David Hull, a well-known evolutionist, stated it best when he said:

"Whatever God implied by evolutionary theory... may be like, He is not the Protestant God of waste not, want not. <u>He is also not a loving God who cares about his productions.</u>.. The God of the Galapagos [Islands] is careless, wasteful, indifferent, almost diabolical. <u>He is certainly not the sort of God to whom anyone would be inclined to pray.</u>"

I am surprised that Christians would defend such a retarded and evil god in their ministries. That's not the God of the Bible. I can see two main reasons why Christians hold on to evolution:

- #1 -- I would say that most of these men honestly think they are teaching the truth. They simply don't know any better, and I am working hard to make sure they can get the truth from our ministry. However, even if they do not learn the truth about science, they should not be compromising God's Word to satisfy the masses.
- #2 -- There are some I have seen who are purposefully trying to take as much of a neutral stance as they can to keep their numbers up. They know if they took a strict Biblical stance that it would eliminate a great deal of popularity and income from their ministry. They are doing what is convenient, instead of what is right. It is unfortunate, but there are many self-proclaimed Christians out there who think protecting their organization is more important than teaching the truth.

If any of the men I listed in this article would come forward and state their position clearly, and they do not support billions of years, I will be happy and excited to remove them from this list. Until then, I would recommend that if you like listening to these men preach, continue to do so, but be cautious of what you are hearing. Just do what the Bereans did:

These were more noble than those in Thessalonica, in that they received the word with all readiness of mind, and searched the scriptures daily, whether those things were so.

-Acts 17:11

We all have to learn as a child to eat the meat and spit out the bones. Take in what is correct, and throw out what is incorrect. Stand firm on the Biblical foundation, and not on the assumptions of a phony religion like evolution.
